## Rules of the Game:

Goal	Try to be the first team to line up their own players correctly.
Rules	There needs to be 2 or more groups of children of various sizes
Steps	Step 1: Start by splitting the learners into equal groups as teams and stick a note with consecutive numbers on the back of each child. Try to have at least 2-3 teams.
	Step 2: Learners will read the number that each of their teammates has on their back.
	Step 3: Then race as a team to organize in a number line from smallest to largest according to the numbers they have been assigned.
	Step 4: The first team to finish their lineup correctly wins.

Variations of the Game	The teams have to line up from largest to smallest number. (no talking)
Enrichment	Use bigger numbers and/or add gaps to numbers to make it more challenging for the learners. For example Child 1 gets 5, Child 2 gets 21, Child 3 gets 57, Child 4 gets 90, Child 5 gets 105 etc.
Simplification	Only use numbers from 1 – 10 Instead of writing numbers, draw pictures of objects with various counts (ex, 3 apples, 6 apples, 1 apple, etc.)

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
